



EX CYCLONE ALFRED


In March, there was news that Parts of Queensland and Northern NSW were to be hit by Cyclone Alfred, an Ex-tropical Cyclone that brang widespread heavy rain and Strong winds. Around 300,000-350,000 houses have been left without power.

DETAILS OF THE EVENT

This weather phenomenon began on the 20th of February, where the storm originated from the coral seas just off the coast of Queensland near Moreton Bay, Brisbane. It then slowly moved its way across parts of Queensland and northern NSW as it continued developing. Cyclone Alfred was downgraded from a Category 2 cyclone to a Category 1 tropical cyclone. Almost 20,000 residents around these areas were still told to evacuate by the SES (State Emergency Service) to minimise people being injured or isolated throughout the extreme weather event. Its heavy and strong winds damaged and ripped apart countless buildings and homes and caused extreme erosion along the coastline as it crossed the mainland, and was said to still be moving inward. More than 300,000 Queensland and NSW residents lost power due to this event and many were still without power for quite a while.







This event not only impacted Queensland but also Northern parts of NSW such as Coffs Harbour, Port Macquarie, Lismore, Grafton and more. These areas had been deeply affected with the dangerous floodwaters that overrun local rivers and waterways. They thankfully had members of the SES, the ADF and Nema spread throughout the region helping to get people back on their feet.
